GETTING TO SITE

Cirencester Park

Please follow the Strategy and Evolution waymarked route – this will lead you to approach from the Stroud Road.

No access via Daglingworth

There is no access to Strategy and Evolution through the village of Daglingworth.

On arrival at the site there will be a one-way system in operation. Please follow the signs and directions of the marshals. There may be queues when arriving or leaving the site we welcome your patience during this time. Exit from site is a left turn only.

Please note there may be the need for us to stop traffic for the safety of the young people on site. At this time no vehicles will be able to move. We welcome your patience during these times.

No dogs on site

No dogs are allowed on site. This includes drop-off and pick-up.

On site

You will be able access site from 9am. Please be aware the site is already open to our sister event Evolution, so access will not be permitted before this.

Prior to arrival, you will be given a wristband colour by your leader. When you arrive you will meet your leaders at the flag which matches your wristband colour.

FACILITIES

The Café and tuck shop

There is a café on site serving a range of cold food and drinks. There will be a selection of healthy alternatives as well as some S&E sweets and treats! The tuck shop will also be open. Please ensure small change is brought in a named wallet or purse.

Please note: whilst we take every care to reduce the risk of cross contamination, the Strategy and Evolution Café is unable to guarantee a completely allergen free environment as food containing allergens are prepared within the café.

Toilets

The toilet doors are spring loaded and you may need support opening these. We do have accessible toilets available please speak to a helper if you need access. We encourage the use of groups when attending the toilets.

Chill Tent

During the weekend the chill tent is available as a quieter space on site for both adults and young people. It's an area to wind down and relax with access to our inclusion team to talk to about any worries or issues you may have. Please be aware young people need to be accompanied by a leader. The team are also there to talk through an inclusion queries that leaders may have.

Shop

There will be loads of S&E branded items to buy from pens and badges to neckers and t-shirts. So don't forget a bit of spending money! You can see a selection and pre-order online at shop.s-e.org.uk. Pre-ordering ensures the items you want are available as we often sell-out of popular sizes and colours.

Coffee Van

We recognise that it's an early start to the day, so in the morning they'll be a coffee van selling a variety of teas, coffees and small snacks in the car park.

Programme schedule

Each wristband group rotates through the four seasonal zones across the day.

MAIN EVENT

All attendees will be put into groups of around 75-100 young people (and their adults). Your Drey / Unit or Colony will be kept together.

When you hear a Klaxon / "Bing-bong" sound, groups will follow someone with a coloured flag to the next zone, this flag will match the colour on your wristbands. Please don't leave the programme zone until advised.

There will be a number of activities in each zone, including: Team games, Individual activities, Experiments, Quiet activities and crafts.

Every young person will be given a Discover passport to fill in as they go round. This will help you know what activities they have done when they come home. Your leader will be given guidance on what badge or requirements each activity contributes towards. Please encourage all of your young people to do as many activities as possible. There are over 40 activities planned, so please recognise your young people may not get to do all of them.

There will be an adult at every activity to support, who can help young people with some of the activities (e.g. cutting things out and encouraging taking turns and good sharing).

At lunchtime, there will be plenty of space for you to eat lunch with your group, whether that is under shade or in the open.

In the event of wet weather some activities may not be available, and many will move indoors.

Programme zones will include a visit to a Tuck shop and the on-site shop for merchandise. Card and contactless is accepted, young people are encouraged to bring small change if wanted.

New for 2026, we will have an activity with Reptiles and minibeasts, if your young person has a Nut allergy please make sure their leader know and so they can make the team aware when they take part in this activity.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Each group will have an emergency contact your leader will let you know who this is.

First aid

In the first instance, leaders are responsible for first aid. If required, there is a medical team on site for more serious injuries.

Lost person

If you are lost or you have lost somebody, please make your way to the nearest helper in a hi-vis jacket or to the admin tent.

Insect & tick bites

Due to the events taking place in fields and woodland there is the risk of being bitten or stung by insects including horseflies, wasps and ticks. It is important to be aware of ticks and to safely remove them as soon as possible, just in case.

We recommend bringing insect repellent and insect bite creams/clickers & antihistamines as part of your first aid kit.

- To reduce the risk of being bitten:
- Cover your skin while walking outdoors and tuck your trousers into your socks.
- Use insect repellent on your clothes and skin.
- Stick to paths whenever possible.
- Wear light-coloured clothing so ticks are easier to spot and brush off.

To remove a tick safely

You don't need to do anything else unless you become unwell.

See a GP if you've been bitten by a tick and you get flu-like symptoms (such as feeling hot and shivery, headaches, aching muscles or feeling sick) or a circular red rash. Always remember to tell them you've been in forests and grassy areas.

1. Use fine-tipped tweezers or a tick-removal tool.
2. Grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible.
3. Slowly pull upwards, taking care not to squeeze or crush the tick.
4. Clean the bite with antiseptic or soap and water.

Wristbands

Everyone on site must have a S&E wristband. Leaders should challenge people without one, and escort them to admin. If you feel unable to challenge somebody, please ask an S&E volunteer.
