Hazard	Who Might Be Harmed	Is the Risk Adequately Controlled, or is More Needed	Review and Revision
Injury from generators	Participants	All generators to be properly demarcated to prevent accidental access	
Overexcitement or fatigue preventing rule following	Participants	Rules should be clearly explained at the start of each activity, each time it is run. Ensure adequate supervision at all times, including when queuing	
Fatigue	Participants	All activities are optional. A range of activities/quieter options available. Plenty of rest space/shade in marquees. Water easily accessible.	
Safeguarding	Participants	The Scouting Young people first yellow card is used throughout the Strategy and Evolution Events. All leaders are given a copy on arrival and must be up to date with their training. There is a designated Safeguarding lead and as per the code of behaviour all safeguarding concerns are reported to national HQ. External activity providers to be supervised at all times.	
Cold / Wet / Heat / Other inclement weather	Everyone	Follow supplier instructions regarding equipment in inclement weather

Hazard	Who Might Be Harmed	Is the Risk Adequately Controlled, or is More Needed	Review and Revision
Collisions	Participants and spectators	Adult referees to supervise the games and ensure spectators are at a safe distance. All sports will be non-contact	
Injury from damaged equipment	Participants	All equipment will be checked prior to the activity taking place. Any damaged equipment should be replaced before use.	
Personal injury	Participants	The ground should be checked prior to the activity starting by the adult referee, and the activity moved to a new location if required. Tarp to be secured to the ground for hmpo hockey. Activities may need to be cancelled in the case of extreme weather conditions.	
Safeguarding	Participants	Only under 18s may participate in the sport activities. Competitions will be limited to only include sections of the same age (i.e. Brownies and Cubs, Guides and Scouts, Explorers and Rangers)	
Impairment from equipment (mop)	Participants and spectators	Adult referees to supervise the games and ensure participants are briefed to keep one hand at the top of the mop so they know where it is and the mop head on the tarp at all times.

Viewing of inappropriate content	Participants	All devices to be set up with the activity prior to young people being given access. Adult supervision at all times.	
Electrocution	Participants	All equipment should be examined prior to the activity. Any faulty equipment should not be used. Equipment should only be used under shelter.
