		Activity to be supervised by one or more Scouts / Guides volunteers	
Over enthusiastic participants	Participants	Shoes to be removed before use	
		Responsible person to supervise at all times Slide feet first. Do not leap from platform. Use obstacles with consideration to others	
Overcrowding	Participants	Activity to be supervised by one or more Scouts / Guides volunteers	
		Responsible person to supervise at all times. Restrict numbers on entry. Slide one person at a time. Do not enter unit from the exit end	
Injury from falling from height	Participants	Activity to be supervised by one or more Scouts / Guides volunteers, maximum number to be agreed and adhered to	
		Responsible person to supervise at all times. Climbing, hanging, sitting on walls is prohibited.	
Adverse weather	Participants	Activity to be supervised by one or more Scouts / Guides volunteers, maximum number to be agreed and adhered to	
		Equipment not to be used in high winds over 24mph (including gusts) and heavy rain	
Injury from hard surfaces	Participants	Use on a grassed area using industry standard stakes	
Injury from poor supervision	Participants	Responsible person to supervise at all times	
		Do not use without adequate supervisors present	
Tripping over anchor points and auxiliary equipment	Participants	Activity to be supervised by one or more Scouts / Guides volunteers	
		Anchor points installed to manufactures guidance. Additional equipment stored away. Power cables to be positioned / covered appropriately	
Injury through incorrect positioning	Participants	Equipment installed correctly in a safe position. Never attempt to reposition the unit	
Choking	Participants	No foods / chewing gum / drinks allowed on the equipment	
		Participant leaders / volunteers to supervise young people	
Third party injury	Participants	Activity to be supervised by one or more Scouts / Guides volunteers	
		Remove shoes, eye glasses, jewellery, badges and lanyards. All drinking containers to be positioned away from play areas Sharp / solid objects removed from pocket	
Historical injury	Participants	Activity to be supervised by one or more Scouts / Guides volunteers	
		No user should have a history of back or neck problems, have heart issues, is pregnant, is under the influence of drugs / drink or feeling unwell	
Inflation with combustion engine / gennie	Participants	Participant leaders / volunteers to supervise young people	
		Activity to be supervised by one or more Scouts / Guides volunteers	
Emergency	Participants	No Smoking. Spare fuel to be located in a locked store. Fencing installed around plant area.	
		Smoking only permitted in designated smoking areas	
Emergency	Participants	In the event of a serious injury do not move the individual and call First Aid	
		All volunteer leaders should have access to First Aid kit for minor injuries, for more serious contact FA tent
