Crowding at the display - Too many young people trying to stick notes at once.	Young people	Volunteers encourage turn taking	
		Small groups managed by adult volunteers Calm pace reinforced throughout	
Slips, trips or falls - Uneven ground, bags, or crowding around the display.	Young people	Area checked before the activity begins	
		Display positioned away from main walkways	
		Floor area kept clear of loose items	
Display becoming unstable - Rainbow, cloud or sun backing coming loose or falling.		Volunteers manage group movement and spacing	
		Rainbow securely mounted before the activity starts	
		Volunteers check stability regularly Activity stopped immediately if display becomes unstable	
Overexcited behaviour - Pushing, rushing, or unsafe behaviour.	Young people	Clear expectations set at the start	
		Volunteers reinforce calm, positive behaviour Activity paused if needed to reset behaviour	
Use of pens - Minor injury or mess.	Young people	Age appropriate equipment only - Non-toxic felt pens to be used	
		Child safe pens only (lids have holes in)	
		Volunteers supervise use of pens Any damaged or unsafe items removed	
Emotional distress - Young people feeling unsure what to write or becoming upset.	Young people	Volunteers offer reassurance and suggestions	
		Adult volunteers support individual needs Young people allowed to contribute with help or observe if preferred
