Drowning in bubble tray	Young people, adults	Young people to be supervised at all times by supervising leaders and young people's supporting adults	
		Many leaders will have First Response training, with additional support from on-site First Aid	
Slips and falls from spilt water / bubble mix	Young people, adults	Activity to be placed in an area with low thoroughfare on well grassed area, where ground becomes wet, carry out dynamic risk assessment and move the activity	
Swallowed bubble mixture, mild irritation	Young people	Young people to be supervised at all times by supervising leaders and young people's supporting adults including a reminder to not drink the solution	
		Use non-toxic, child-safe bubble mixture only.	
Bubble mixture splashing into eyes - Splashes may cause temporary eye irritation.	Young people, adults	Encourage Young People to hold tools away from faces and to not blow towards others	
		Many leaders will have First Response training, with additional support from on-site First Aid	
		Site first aid kit to include eye wash	
Hypothermia if wet and cold	Young people	Activity to be supervised by adults at all times	
		Towels to be available for those that get very wet	
Overexcitement or unsafe behaviour - Excitement may lead to running, grabbing tools, or splashing.	Young people	Adults model calm behaviour and reinforce turn-taking.	
		Remove activity if play becomes unsafe.
