Fingers trodden on when arriving, moving about or leaving	Young people & adults	Plenty of space with walkways through to front of seated area Minimise need to get up and down Give clear instructions before each showing to stay sat down throughout showing Many leaders will have First Response training, with additional support from on-site First Aid	
Crowd management / personal space - Young People sitting too close may push, argue, or feel uncomfortable.	Young people	Adults help Young People sit with adequate personal space. Arrange seating in small groups or rows. Intervene early if Young People become unsettled.	
Screen content suitability - Content could frighten, upset, or overstimulate Young People	Young people	All videos will be chosen and checked by adults, content to be age-appropriate, short and calm. Scary themes, sudden loud noises and flashing images have been avoided. Adult to observe Young People and stop the video if distress occurs.	
Electricution from faulty equipment or spillages	Young people & adults	No fluids to be placed near equipment, if raining, equipment to be placed well away from doorway and wall of tents / marquee Only adults to use the equipment Equipment to be checked before use Equipment to be PAT tested	
Sitting on the floor may cause discomfort, restlessness, or poor posture.	Young people & adults	All movies to be less than 10 minutes and groups encouraged to move on after watching one movie. Young People may change position quietly if needed.	
Choking - whilst eating snacks	Young people & adults	Minimise activity involvement whilst eating, everyone encouraged to stay sat down Many leaders will have First Response training, with additional support from on-site First Aid	
Young People moving to sit down or standing up may trip over carpet/mat edges, bags, or other Young People. Slips, trips, and falls (during settling or moving)	Young people	Ensure carpet tiles / foam mats are flat, secure, and evenly laid. Young People to walk, not run, when entering or leaving.	
Screen brightness, sound, and sensory issues - Screen too loud or bright may cause discomfort, especially for sensitive Young People.	Young people	Well lit viewing area (not dark) Young people with known sensory sensitivities identified in advance and supported by adults who know them Set volume at a moderate, child-friendly level.
